- *Elektromotoren von BorgWarner werden in Dedicated Hybrid Transmission (DHT)- und in Range Extended (REEV)-Elektrofahrzeugen des Herstellers eingesetzt*
- *BorgWarner erschließt den DHT- und REEV-Markt mit hocheffizienten, kompaktem und wettbewerbsfähigen High Voltage Hairpin Motoren*

Auburn Hills, Michigan, 4. Mai 2023 – BorgWarner wurde ausgewählt, HVH (High Voltage Hairpin)-E-Motoren an einen führenden chinesischen Automobilhersteller zu liefern. Sie kommen in den DHT und REEV-Elektrofahrzeugen des Herstellers zum Einsatz. Die Serienproduktion soll im August 2023 in Tianjin beginnen.
